This vendor did not meet the specified minimum experience requirements, detailed in Section 4.07.A (attached). Also no critical path schedule was submitted with their bid, as required by Sections 8.02 and 6.02.A (attached).

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Vineland that said contract to Complete Construction of Clayville Unit #1 for the Vineland Municipal Electric Utility, be and the same is awarded to Infrastructure and Industrial Energy, LLC, Pittsburgh, PA, on their bid in the amount of \$25,555,000.00 plus a contingency in the amount of \$1,458,000.00 for a total award amount of \$27,013,000.00, said bid being the lowest responsive and responsible bid received and considered in the best interest of the City of Vineland, and the Purchasing Agent be and the same is hereby authorized and directed to issue purchase order contract for the same in behalf of the City; and

It is the recommendation of the Director of Municipal Utilities, which has the concurrence of the Business Administrator and the Purchasing Agent that a contract be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Infrastructure and Industrial Energy, LLC, Pittsburgh, PA, in the amount of \$25,555,000.00 plus a contingency in the amount of \$1,458,000.00 for a total award amount of \$27,013,000.00.

The low bidder, C& H Industrial Services' bid was deemed not "Responsible", in accordance N.J.S.A. 40a:11-1 et seq, because the bidders minimum experience requirements did not satisfy the criteria listed in specification section 4.07.A.

Section 6.02.A of the specification defines "Submittals With Bid... Submittals shall be submitted to the Owner. Submit each of the following: Item 16. Seller's critical path schedule detailing how the Owners milestones detailed in Paragraph 2.10 will be achieved." Since no critical path schedule was submitted with the C&H Industries bid, as required, this bid must be considered not "Responsive" in accordance with N.J.S.A.40A:11-1 et seq.

Justification for Vendor Recommendation

Construction of Clayville Unit # 1

In response to the RFP offered for public bidding on December 10, 2013 for the construction of Clayville Unit 1 generating station, three bids were received on January 7, 2014, as detailed on the attached Tabulation of Bids.

Specification Part 8. Evaluation of Bids, sections 8.01 (Evaluation Criteria) and 8.02 Rejection of Proposals (copies attached) provided bidders the basis for the evaluation of bids

In order of the lowest bid listed first, the bidders were: C & H Industrial Services, Infrastructure and Industrial Energy LLC and Conti Enterprises Inc.

Upon review of the lowest bid submitted by C & H Industrial Services two fatal flaws were discovered.

1. Section 4.07.A of the specification (copy attached) details Bidder's Minimum Experience Requirements which include, in part:" Bidder has performed work as a Design/Builder, EPC contractor or general contractor on at least four (4) power generation projects deemed similar to the scope of work defined in these Contract Documents....Each project presented as similar experience must have a net output greater than 15MW and valued at over \$30 million."

C&H Industrial Services, Inc. response to this requirement is their "Jobs In Progress" listing (copy attached). None of the jobs listed satisfy the criteria listed in specification section 4.07.A.

Consequently, this bid must be considered not "Responsible", in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40a:11 -1 et seq. (32) (copy attached).

2. The CHECK LIST included in the RFP (copy attached) includes in item 12 the requirements that the specific Submittals, defined in Sections 2.06A, 4.04F and 6.02A "MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH YOUR BID PACKAGED..." Further, at the bottom of the CHECK LIST is the following statement: "<u>WARNING</u>: If the items checked above are not...included in your bid package, it may cause your bid to be automatically rejected."

Section 6.02.A of the specification (copy attached) defines "Submittals With Bid... Submittals shall be submitted to the Owner. Submit each of the following: Item 16. Seller's critical path schedule detailing how the Owners milestones detailed in Paragraph 2.10 will be achieved."

A copy of specification section 2.10.D of the specification is also attached, and states in part: " The Seller...will submit a detail critical path schedule detailing his execution plan for meeting the Owner's project schedule milestones described in this paragraph 2.10 A through D."

Attached is a page from C & H Industries' bid dated November 8, 2013 that responds to this requirement that states in part: "<u>Answer</u>: C&H Industrial Services will follow & maintain

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supplied contract schedule." No critical path schedule was submitted with the C & H Industries bid.

Since no critical path schedule was submitted with the C&H Industries bid, as required, this bid must be considered not "Responsive" in accordance with N.J.S.A.40A:11-1 et seq. (copy attached).

In addition, since no critical path schedule was submitted per specification section 6.02.A requirement, section 8.02.A provides a clear basis for rejection of this bid.

The second lowest bid submitted by Infrastructure and Industrial Energy LLC was reviewed in detail and found to be Responsive and Responsible.

8.02 Rejection of Proposals

- A. Proposals may be rejected for failure to submit mandatory items of this specification per Paragraph 6.02A.
- B. Per N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2., a contracting unit may reject all Proposals for any of the following reasons:
 - 1. The lowest bid/proposal exceeds the cost estimates for the goods or services.
 - 2. The lowest bid/proposal exceeds the contracting unit's appropriation for the goods or services.
 - 3. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to abandon the project for provision or performance of the goods or services.
 - 4. The contracting unit wants to revise the specifications for the goods or services.

A. Whenever, in the opinion of the Owner, the Seller has not taken sufficient precaution for the safety of the public or the protection of the work to be constructed under this Contract or of adjacent structures or property, and whenever, in the opinion of the Owner, an emergency has arisen and immediate action is considered necessary, then the Owner, with or without notice to the Seller, may provide suitable protection by causing work to be done and material to be furnished and placed.

B. The cost of such work and material shall be borne by the Seller, and if the same is not paid on presentation of the bills therefore, such costs may be deducted from any amounts due or to become due the Seller. The performance of such emergency work shall not relieve the Seller of responsibility for any damage which may occur.

- 4.06 Qualification of Workers
 - A. The Seller shall employ only workmen who are competent to perform the work assigned to them and, in the case of skilled labor, who are adequately trained and experienced in their respective field of work/expertise/trade and who do satisfactory work.
 - B. The Seller shall immediately remove from the work, whenever requested to do so by the Owner, any person considered by the Owner to be incompetent or disorderly, or for any other reason unsatisfactory or undesirable to the Owner, and such person shall not again be employed on the work without the consent of the Owner.
 - C. All welders shall be qualified as per Specification section 400510
- 4.07 Bidder's Minimum Experience Requirements
 - A. Bidders shall meet the following minimum experience and qualifications
 criteria. Owner reserves the right to judge each similar project as applicable
 based on the merits of the project presented in Bidder's proposal:
 - Bidder has performed work as a Design/Builder, EPC contractor or general contractor on at least four (4) power generation projects deemed similar to the scope of work defined in these Contract Documents. Owner deems similar work to include power generation projects using combustion turbines as a prime mover for projects such as Combustion Turbine Combined Cycle (CTCC), Simple Cycle Combustion Turbine (SCCT), or Gas Turbine based Combined Heat & Power (GT-CHP) project. Each project presented as similar experience must have a net output greater than 15MW and valued at over \$30 million. Each project must have been completed within the last 10 years, or is currently in construction.
 - 2. Bidder specifically identifies a full-time project manager in responsible charge of the work with at least 5 years experience as project manager on comparable projects for constructing power generating facilities.
