This is a <u>reimbursement grant</u>, meaning your agency will incur the costs and then submit documentation to the Division to be reimbursed. The <u>maximum hourly rate that will be reimbursed for the enforcement overtime is \$55 per hour</u>.

After you have submitted your completed application through SAGE, you will be notified of your approval through SAGE, as well. <u>No written approvals will be sent out</u>.
