Dear John:

Thank you for your membership in the American Public Power Association. Your annual dues are up for renewal, and now more than ever, APPA needs your support to help us provide a strong collective voice for public power.

APPA understands the enormous constraints the COVID-19 pandemic is placing on your utility. APPA staff are working hard to provide you with information and resources that address the myriad of issues your utility and community face during this crisis. You and your team can access these tools 24/7 on our Public Power COVID-19 Information Hub at **PublicPower.org/topic/COVID-19**.

APPA continues to educate Hill staff on how public power utilities are being impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and is pressing for short-term financial assistance to public power utilities that are facing liquidity challenges as a result of declining load and increased non-payments by customers. Additionally, APPA is pushing for other financial relief measures for its members, including:

- increasing funding for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP):
- · restoration of advance refunding bonds;
- increasing the small-issuer exception from \$10 million to \$30 million;
- ending the sequestration of direct payment bonds, such as Build America Bonds;
- enabling public power utilities to be eligible for the Payroll Tax Credit to offset the costs of the expanded Family Medical Leave Act and sick leave provisions included in the Families First Coronavirus Relief Act; and,
- ensuring that supplemental emergency funds given to the Power Marketing Administrations, Bureau of Reclamation, and Army Corps of Engineers is deemed non-reimbursable (to ensure these costs are not passed through to customers through increased rates).

In addition, if the next COVID-19 bill includes language to extend the length of energy tax credits, such as the wind production tax credit or solar investment tax credit, APPA will push for the inclusion of comparable incentives for public power utilities to allow them to benefit from these credits.

As Congress and the federal government resume normal activities in the future, APPA will continue to advocate on the issues that matter to public power, including:

- educating federal lawmakers on public power's efforts to reduce its carbon dioxide emissions;
- · advocating to provide public power with comparable energy-related tax incentives;
- fighting efforts to repeal or gut public power's exemption from federal pole attachment regulations;
- supporting legislation to provide grants to public power utilities and others for the deployment of electric vehicle charging infrastructure along national corridors;

- informing federal lawmakers how the electric sector works closely with its federal government partners to protect the grid from a cyber or physical attack; and,
- defending against proposals to divest the transmission assets of the Power Marketing Administrations (PMAs) and Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA).

Because of your APPA membership, your team can access the vital resources they need to succeed during COVID-19 and beyond, including:

- staff experts on federal legislative and policy issues, engineering and operations, safety, cyber and physical security, disaster planning and response, customer services, communications, human resources, and more;
- · members-only reports, surveys, and statistical analysis;
- peer-driven electronic discussion forums in all operational areas;
- · complimentary and low-cost virtual and in-person education and training;
- utility operations tools, like the eReliability Tracker and eSafety Tracker web-based services, to help you track and analyze critical operations areas;
- utility programs, like the Reliable Public Power Provider (RP3) and the Smart Energy Provider (SEP) programs, that help you benchmark your operations against industry peers and gain valuable recognition for your efforts;
- · award-winning Public Power magazine and Public Power Daily e-newsletter;
- · discounts on publications and software through our online Product Store; and,
- public power's research and grant program, Demonstration of Energy & Efficiency Developments (DEED). Join DEED to access grants up to \$125,000 and scholarships up to \$5,000 annually.

In the coming months, APPA will be looking very closely at its expenses and cutting costs where possible without compromising the benefits and services we provide our members, and we are holding the line on membership dues. As of July 1, 2020, there are no foreseen dues increases through 2021.
