ORDINANCE NO. 2022-<u>62</u>

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR NO PARKING RESTRICTIONS ALONG A PORTION OF GLENN TERRACE.

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has recommended that parking be prohibited along a portion of Glenn Terrace because of concerns that the roadway is not wide enough to accommodate parking on both sides of the street with two-way traffic; and

WHEREAS, currently, parking is permitted on both sides of Glenn Terrace which is about 29 feet wide from curb to curb.

WHEREAS, said recommendation has the concurrence of the Vineland Police Department and the City Solicitor and is considered to be in the best interest of the City of Vineland; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VINELAND THAT:

SECTION 1. No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Glenn Terrace	East	From the easterly curbline of Roberts Boulevard (at the southeast corner) to a point 260 feet south thereof.

SECTION 2. Signs shall be erected and maintained as authorized by the Commissioner of Transportation of the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

Bob Dickenson, Business Administrator:

I have received concerns from residents regarding on-street parking along Glenn Terrace, south of Roberts Boulevard. As a result, I investigated the site and found that the roadway is not wide enough to accommodate parking on both sides of the street with two-way traffic. The roadway is 29 feet wide, which is only enough room to permit parking on one side of the road.

A letter was sent to all residents/property owners along this section of Glenn Terrace in September of last year. The letter was sent to notify them of the upcoming parking restriction as well as obtain their feedback on which side to restrict parking. Only one resident reached out to the Engineering office, where the resident stated they were agreeable to having parking restricted on their side of the street (east side).

Please prepare an Ordinance establishing No Parking along Glenn Terrace as follows:
