RESOLUTION NO. 2024- 38

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXCLUSION OF THE PUBLIC FROM A MEETING BETWEEN THE MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL, CITY CLERK AND STAFF, BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR AND STAFF, CITY SOLICITOR AND STAFF, DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY, AND LAW FIRM OF BROWN AND CONNERY, LLP CONCERNING MATTERS RELATING TO LITIGATION IN WHICH THE PUBLIC BODY IS OR MAY BECOME A PARTY AND MATTERS FALLING UNDER THE ATTORNEY CLIENT PRIVILEGE AND AUTHORIZING THE DISCLOSURE OF MINUTES OF SAID MEETING AS PROVIDED HEREIN.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, Open Public Meetings Act, permits the exclusion of the public from the meeting of a public body where the subject matter of that meeting involves matters relating to litigation in which the public body is or may become a party and matters falling within the attorney-client privilege; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Vineland desires to meet with the Mayor, City Clerk and Staff, Business Administrator and Staff, City Solicitor and Staff, Director of Public Safety, and the Law Firm of Brown and Connery, LLP to discuss the matter of <u>Rudolph Beu, City of Vineland</u> Docket CSR 09763-22.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Vineland that:

- The public shall be excluded from a meeting of the Council of the City of Vineland, Mayor, City Clerk and Staff, Business Administrator and Staff, City Solicitor and Staff, Director of Public Safety, and the Law Firm of Brown and Connery, LLP immediately following or during the Regular Session of City Council, on January 23, 2024 in the Caucus Room or Council Chambers, City Hall, Vineland.
- 2. The general nature of the subject matter of the closed meeting shall pertain to the matter of Rudolph Beu, City of Vineland Docket CSR 09763-22
- 3. Disclosure of the minutes of the closed meeting authorized above between the Mayor, Council of the City of Vineland, City Clerk and Staff, Business Administrator and Staff, City Solicitor and Staff, Director of Public Safety, and the Law Firm of Brown and Connery, LLP shall be made following a final decision and determination of said matter excepting information which must remain private.
- 4. It is anticipated that the minutes of the deliberation conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public within 6 months, however, any personal confidential information may not be released.
