#### ORDINANCE NO. 2025-29

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$800,000 FOR CLOSURE OF THE SANITARY LANDFILL IN AND BY THE CITY OF VINELAND, IN THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, NEW JERSEY, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$760,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VINELAND, IN THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance has heretofore been authorized to be undertaken by the City of Vineland, in the County of Cumberland, New Jersey (the "City") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the supplemental amount of \$800,000, such sum being in addition to the \$2,600,000 appropriated therefor by bond ordinance #1989-16 of the City, finally adopted March 28,1989 ("Bond Ordinance #1989-16") and the \$100,000 appropriated by bond ordinance #2006-62, finally adopted July 25, 2006 ("Bond Ordinance #2026-62" and together with Bond Ordinance #1989-16, the "Original Bond Ordinance"), and including the sum of \$40,000 as the additional down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The additional down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the additional cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the additional down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$760,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement heretofore authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is the closure of the sanitary landfill facility of the City located in the southwesterly section thereof and situated on lands comprising 89.55 acres, of which approximately 50 acres are filled, bordered on the west by Mill Road, on the south by Elm Road and on the north by Walnut Road, including costs of placement of earthen or vegetative cover, installation of methane gas vents or monitors, leachate monitoring wells or collection systems, including also engineering design, consultant inspection, monitoring and maintenance of all such systems during the construction phase of closure, required fees and permits and any other measures required by the Department of Environmental Protection to prevent, minimize or monitor pollution or health hazards resulting from said sanitary landfill facility, all as shown on the plans and specifications prepared or to be prepared therefor and filed in the office of the City Clerk and hereby approved.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is \$1,045,000, including the \$285,000 authorized by the Original Bond Ordinance 1989-16 and the \$760,000 bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized herein.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is \$3,500,000, including the \$2,600,000 appropriated by Bond Ordinance #1989-16, the \$100,000 appropriated by Bond Ordinance #2006-62 and the \$800,000 appropriated herein.

All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such Section 4. times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The City hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the City may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 15 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$760,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$1,400,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement. Of this amount, \$675,000 was estimated for these items of expense in Bond Ordinance #1989-16, \$645,000 was estimated for these items of expense in Bond Ordinance #2006-62 and an additional \$80,000 is estimated therefor herein.

Section 7. The City hereby declares the intent of the City to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the City is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the City and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the City. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the City pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the City and

to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the City fails to comply with its undertaking, the City shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the City for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

### Dear Yolanda:

In accordance with your request, I have prepared and enclose herewith a form of supplemental bond ordinance providing for the closure of the sanitary landfill. The bond ordinance should be adopted in accordance with the usual procedure set forth below for your convenience.

The electronic Supplemental Debt Statement should be prepared on the date of introduction of the bond ordinance and sent to the Clerk on that same date. The Supplemental Debt Statement should also be filed electronically with the Division of Local Government Services prior to final adoption of the bond ordinance. Please retain a copy of the electronic receipt sent to you by the Division of Local Government Services, as we will need a copy for our records. In order to comply with the capital budget regulations, the bond ordinance contains a provision amending the capital budget to the extent of any inconsistency with the bond ordinance and it should be sent to Trenton and filed along with the resolution of the governing body in the form required by the Local Finance Board showing the details of the amended capital budget. It will not be necessary to publish the resolution.

The bond ordinance may be introduced and read by title only and adopted by a majority of the members of the governing body present, assuming a quorum. After introduction, the Notice of Pending Bond Ordinance and Summary must be published in the local newspaper, a form of which I have enclosed for your use. Also, the bond ordinance should be posted on the bulletin board customarily used for notices, together with the Notice of Pending Bond Ordinance and Summary, and copies of the bond ordinance should be made available to anyone who requests them of the Clerk after introduction.

The bond ordinance can be considered for final adoption not less than ten days after introduction and not less than seven days after the publication of the Notice of Pending Bond Ordinance and Summary. If the bond ordinance has been posted and copies made available as indicated above, the bond ordinance can be read at the second hearing by title only. If the bond ordinance posting procedure has not been followed, the bond ordinance must be read in full at the second hearing. After the bond ordinance is read for the second time, the governing body should hold a public hearing and should give all members of the public a chance to be heard on the bond ordinance. After the public hearing, the bond ordinance can be finally adopted by the affirmative vote of not less than

two-thirds of the full membership of the governing body. After final adoption, the Bond Ordinance Statement and Summary must be published, a copy of which I have enclosed for your use. Note that if the approval of an officer is required to make the bond ordinance effective, the bond ordinance must be approved by that officer, or passed over veto, before it is published after final adoption.

After the bond ordinance is finally adopted, it will be necessary for us to establish a record of proceedings documenting the proper adoption of the bond ordinance. In order to do this, we will need one completely executed set of the documents enumerated on the attached checklist. By copy of this letter, I am sending the Clerk a copy of the checklist along with a copy of the bond ordinance. With the exception of the Affidavits of Publication, I am also sending the Clerk the necessary certificates to be completed, executed and returned to us along with the necessary attachments to provide us with this documentation. It should be noted that the Clerk's Certificate must be executed no sooner than 21 days following the final publication in order to attest that there has been no protest within the statutory twenty-day protest period.

If you or the Clerk have any questions about the form of the bond ordinance, the adoption procedure or the form of the certificates, please call me.
